**Head of Building and Environmental Technology
Lund University**

His lectures at Lund create a balance between strong theoretical discourse, and solidified physical answers to questions of sustainability. In the design studio believes in integrating pragmatic and theoretical analysis to create new knowledge about the most critical environmental design challenges facing society.

Donlyn Lyndon

**Eva Li Professor Emeritus of Architecture and Urban Design
UC Berkeley, College of Environmental Design**

Donlyn Lyndon's architectural and urban design practice has included a continuing series of works at the Sea Ranch CA, where, with MLTW (Moore Lyndon Turnbull Whitaker), he received the distinguished 25 year Award from the AIA. At Lund University, Professor Lyndon's lectures revolve around the daily life aspects of urban design, encouraging students to recognize the simple qualities which enhance urban social life. His work connects especially in the Sustainable Urban Recycling course, where the focus is strategies for implementing appropriate and satisfying places into difficult urban situations.

Danish architect and landscape architect, trained at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Copenhagen 1980. Jeppe Aagaard Andersen has worked both as a landscape architect and as a free artist.
